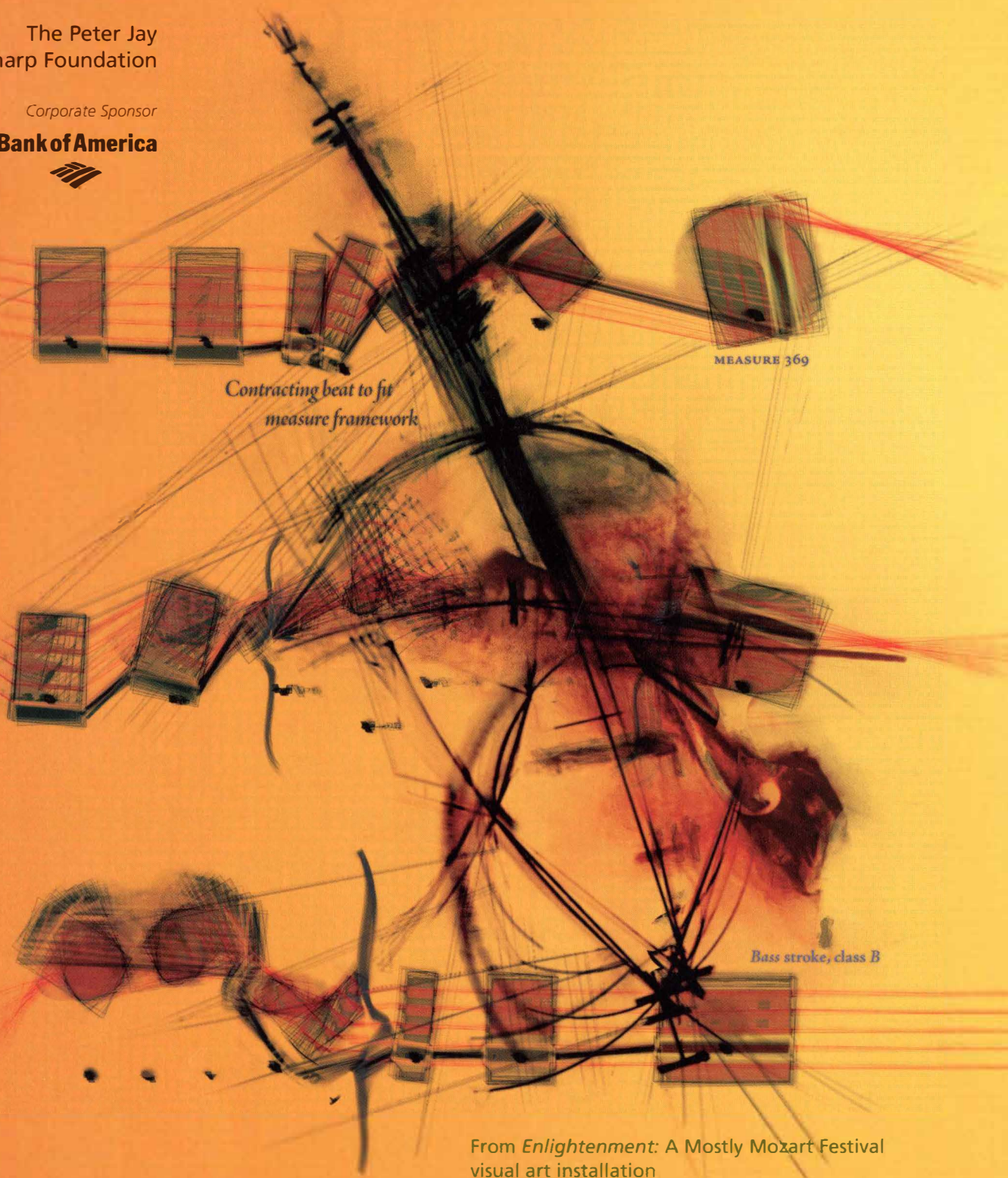

Welcome to Mostly Mozart

This summer we are celebrating two anniversaries: the 250th anniversary of Mozart's birth and 40th anniversary of the Mostly Mozart Festival. To celebrate these shared birthdays, Mostly Mozart is full of commissions, American and world premieres, and new productions, all of which affirm the vitality of Mozart in the creative life of our own time. The world premiere of a new violin concerto by the acclaimed Finnish composer Magnus Lindberg, a new production of Mozart's opera *Zaide* staged by the ever-provocative stage director Peter Sellars, and the world premiere of Mark Morris' exploration of Mozart's love of the piano, *Mozart Dances*, are certain to be among the highlights of this summer's festival. And Mozart points us towards the 22nd century with *Enlightenment*, a digital art installation, created by the OpenEnded Group.

Performing again on the stage installation unveiled at Avery Fisher Hall last season, the Mostly Mozart Festival Orchestra will continue to be the heartbeat of the Festival, complemented by internationally esteemed visiting ensembles and artists. Late-night concerts, films, pre-concert recitals, and lectures will round out this summer's schedule.

Please join us for this special anniversary edition of the Mostly Mozart Festival, a deeply felt homage and tribute to the remarkable genius of our namesake composer, whose gifts never cease to astonish and inspire us.

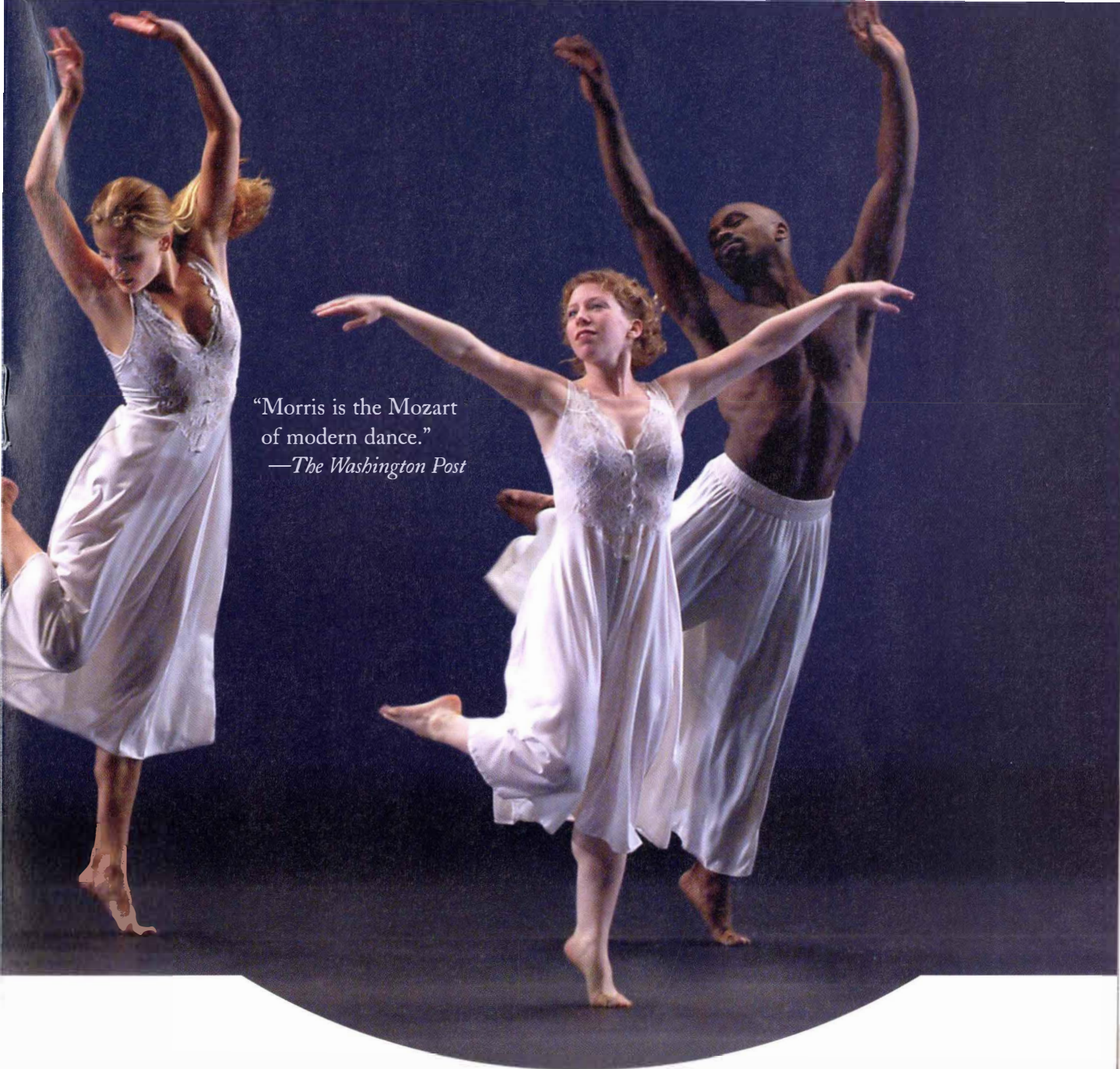
Mozart Dances Mark Morris Dance Group world premiere
